

## Beyschick FAQ's

This page answers most of the common queries that we receive about project beyschick and our Foundation. If you have any additional questions, feel free to contact us.

- What is Project Beyschick?

Project Beyschick is an entrepreneurship program designed to provide students and youth from Canadian aboriginal communities with the opportunity to job shadow CEOs and senior-level executives from some of Canada's leading companies over three consecutive days. The priority for each participant is strictly to observe his/her mentor. Participants will not be asked to get coffee or make photocopies.

- What does Beyschick mean?

Beyschick means One in the local language of the Nishnawbe Aski Nation.

- What is the Nishnawbe Aski Nation (NAN)?

The Nishnawbe Aski Nation (NAN) is a political organization representing 49 First Nations communities across northern Ontario. The NAN territory runs from the Manitoba border to the Quebec border, within the Hudson Bay's and James Bay's watersheds. NAN occupies between one-half and two-thirds of Ontario, spanning a land mass 700 x 400 miles across the north of the province. The estimated population of the NAN communities is 25,000.
